Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Linwood North School Kia ora koutou katoa! Talofa lava! Mālōe lelei! Greetings everyone!





It has been a busy week again with School Photographs, our NZEI Teachers Strike Day and our KiwiCan Community Fundraiser - Country Comes to Town Mufti Day to raise money for the Salvation Army. Thank you so very much to all of our school families for your ongoing support for all our school events and especially our second strike day and the closure of the school for instruction. Next week we look forward to our Senior Athletics Sports (Years 4 - 6) on Monday, our Science Fair in all classes on Thursday afternoon and our School Trip to the Royal NZ Ballet next Friday.

School Uniform

The wearing of our school uniform is compulsory. Our summer school uniform is worn in Terms 1 and 4. Girls may wear a gingham dress or culottes or black shorts with a polo shirt, while boys wear a polo shirt and black shorts in Terms 1 and 4. Please ensure your child is wearing black or white socks. It was very disappointing that there were a large number of students who did not have a red sweatshirt or polar fleece to wear for their school photograph. Both of these red tops are a compulsory part of our uniform.

In 2019 all children will be able to continue to wear their current Linwood North School uniform. Our new Whītau School uniform will be exactly the same uniform with just a change to a new WS logo. We are currently working through the design process of our new School Logo with our graphic designer, Craig Burton, School Branding Matters. We hope to be able to share with you the final design, which reflects our new Whītau School Curriculum, within the next two weeks. Schooltex have now ceased production of our current LNS logo uniform. Once all of the current stock is sold there will be uniform with the new WS logo in store at The Warehouse Eastgate. PLEASE NOTE THAT BECAUSE OF THE CHANGEOVER OF LOGOS, THERE MAY BE A SHORTAGE OF SOME UNIFORM ITEMS/SIZES TO COMMENCE 2019. We are all working extremely hard to ensure as smooth a changeover as possible. There will still be school uniform to borrow at the School Office to support families until the new Whītau School stock is available, should you not be able to make a purchase.

News from Mrs Sprosen - Room 6

We have been busy preparing for our Science Fair by carrying out different experiments and investigations around 'Change'. Our latest scientific wondering was, "Why does bread dough change over time when

yeast is added to it?" We researched and trialled our wondering and found out that the yeast changes the sugar into enough carbon dioxide gas to make the dough rise before the cooking process can begin. We are also learning to use a range of scientific vocabulary to help us explain how and why things happen.

Our Writing focus for the first two weeks of the term was around daily reflections about our swimming progress. The first three weeks of Maths was based on Measurement. One of our learning activities involved making a paper airplane and estimating the distance we believed it would fly. We then flew our paper planes and measured to compare the actual distance with our estimate. Some of us were very close!






